



Subject Evidence Base

The examinations and assessments regulator, Ofqual, has stated;

- Teachers will assess the standard at which you are performing based on what you have been taught so that your school can determine your grade.
- Teachers' judgements should be based on a range of evidence relating to the subject content that your teachers have delivered, either in the classroom or via remote learning.
- Teachers will be able to use evidence about your performance gathered throughout your course to inform their judgement.
- Teachers will use their professional judgement to balance the full range of evidence available for each student against the performance standard set out in the grade descriptors.

JCQ states that;

Although teachers may share results associated with individual pieces of evidence, which could be a grade or a mark, they must not share with students the grades they have or will submit to awarding organisations before results are released.

Students will know some of their results from the evidence base selected but they may not know all of them, especially the results from the latter May in class assessments.
